Dear Teachers:

The Klamath Basin Audubon Society is offering small grants to K-12 teachers through the Wayne and Lois Ann Scott Conservation Education Grant Program. If you need funds for a project that would increase your students' understanding of and appreciation for the natural world, you are encouraged to apply for one of these grants.

Grants requests for up to \$250 will be considered. Projects should involve your entire class and should give students direct, hands-on, and memorable experiences with some aspect of our natural environment. Although other projects will be considered, KBAS encourages the following uses of grant funds:

- 1) Projects that focus on recycling and solid waste issues, and/or awareness of natural resource consumption.
- 2) Projects in which secondary classes develop a conservation education presentation for elementary schools and/or the 2006 Winter Wings Celebration.
- 3) A class field trip to any Klamath Basin Refuge and participation in some type of program or presentation by refuge staff.

Grant funds may also be used for a full scholarship for a teacher to attend a birding workshop at the 2006 Winter Wings Celebration. The application must explain how teacher attendance at this workshop will benefit his or her students.

The deadline for submitting applications is November 15, and you will be notified by Dec. 15 whether your project will be funded.

To apply for one of these grants, please submit the attached application. Mail or email the application to Marjorie Glass at the address given on the application form. Grants will be awarded by a special committee of the Klamath Basin Audubon Society. I am the secretary for that committee, but do not participate in the selection process. Thank you for including natural science projects in your students' education.
